The Isle of Wight (1) , which is located just off the south coast of the United Kingdom, is a short ferry ride from Portsmouth (2) , which is 150 kilometres from London.

The Isle (3) , which is a popular tourist destination, measures thirty-six kilometres from east to west. The landscape of the island, (4) , which is described as beautiful and dramatic, is mostly rural with dramatic coastlines. The island (5) , which has a milder climate than the rest of the UK, is a popular tourist destination.

Thousands of music lovers attend the annual festival (6) , which is held in June. Queen Victoria (7) , who had a house built on the island, was a frequent visitor. The Queen (8) , whose former house is now a major tourist attraction, used to visit the island every summer for many years. As a result it became a fashionable tourist resort at that time. This led to the creation of the many different holiday resorts that exist today.

Alfred, Lord Tennyson (9) , who was the most famous poet during Queen Victoria's reign, was inspired to write the poem 'Crossing the Bar' when he was sailing to the island. The world's first radio station (10) , which can be visited in the west of the island, was set up by Marconi, the Italian inventor (11) , who decided to perform radio experiments there after a visit to the island in 1897. Marconi (12) , who has a road named after him in Hong Kong, later went on to invent the radio.
